Why did John write?



- 1 John 2:3 "by this we know that we have known him"
- 2. 1 John 2:5 "by this we know that we are in him"
- 3. 1 John 3:16 "by this we have known love"
- 4. 1 John 3:19 "by this we will know that we are of the truth"

Why did John write?



- 5. 1 John 3:24 "by this we know that he abides in us"
- 6. 1 John 4:2 "by this you know the spirit of God"
- 1 John 4:13 "by this we know that we abide in him and he in us"
- 1 John 5:2 "by this we know that we love the children of God"

Prologue – 1 John 1:1-4

IJOHN

We proclaim also to you...

- what was from the beginning
- what we have heard
- what we have seen with our eyes
- what we have looked at and our hands have touched
- what we have seen and heard

Prologue – 1 John 1:1-4



We proclaim... WHAT? about the Word of Life

WHY? – "so that"

- you too may have fellowship with us
- our joy may be made complete

Conclusion



John wrote this letter to fellow believers. His goal was to share as much as possible about his personal experience with Christ ("the Word of life") and relationship with the Father with the hope that (at least) two results would occur. First, he wanted his readers to have close fellowship with him. Second, he wanted to be able to celebrate ("joy") their spiritual closeness to both him and God.
